Aupier Family

Michael Aupier B near Auxerre, France.

Soldier in Austrian Succession which ended 1748. M German lady. Moved to Germany and lived on the River Rhine. Came to America 1755, stopped in PA, moved to VA in same year.

5 sons - all served in Revolutionary War.

No 1 Simon, - eldest - served under Washington at Valley Forge, Monmouth, Brandywine, Guilford Court House, siege of Yorktown.
D 1825

No 2 Michael Aupier settled for a while near Blackmore VA. Ambushed, scalped, recovered; earned nickname Bald-Head Mike. Lived years in Lewis Co, is buried there

No 3 Abram Aupier enlisted at Cambridge 1775, served thru war. Settled on Wabash R.

No 4 George Aupier enlisted at Cambridge 1775, served thru war. Settled on Little Kanawha River

No 5 Samuel Aspie, ^{About 1761} youngest, enlisted at age 15, at
Chattanooga, VA and served 2 years.

M Sarah (Sally) Brown, daughter of
Nathaniel Brown. D age 99, 1862

Lived in Culpepper Co VA where 7 of their 8 children
were born, then in Blockhouse Bottom in 1791.
Samuel was killed on a buffalo hunt 1801.
