

# Tilden Henry Caudill

Tilden Henry Caudill is the son of John M. Caudill and Fannie Pennington. He was born September 15, 1876 and died August 27, 1958 in Morehead, Kentucky. Tilden married Rebecca Ann Caudill, the daughter of his first cousin. Rebecca is the daughter of William B. Caudill and Elizabeth Boggs. She was born January 21, 1880, and died December 5, 1957 in Morehead, Kentucky. Tilden and Rebecca are buried in the Brown Cemetery, Morehead, Kentucky. Tilden and Rebecca ran a country store on Rock Fork, off Cranston Road. They also ran the post office.

Nína, Ina, and Tína were triplets. Bessie and Ina died in infancy from spoiled baby formula.

Wilburn got his nickname "Woody" from his baby sister Ruby. She couldn't say Wilburn. The nickname Woody stayed with him for life.

In the late 1950's, just before their deaths, Tilden and Rebecca were the proud grandparents of 51 and the great grandparents of over 30.

Of the 16 children born to Tilden and Rebecca 7 had birthdays in January.

In 1951 the store on Rock Fork was sold at auction. In 1975 the building was destroyed by fire.

Most of Tilden and Rebecca's children stayed in the Morehead area raising their own families. It was not uncommon to ride a school bus with several of your cousins.

#### John M. Caudill

John M. Caudill is the son of Samuel Caudill and Sarah Maggard. He was born March 23, 1833 in Letcher County, Kentucky. John was married two times. His first wife, Jane Boggs, was his first cousin. Jane was the daughter of Abel Boggs and Rebecca Maggard (sister of Sarah Maggard, John's mother)

Bill married (1) Elizabeth Boggs (mother of all his children), and (2) Phena Myers Alfrey. William and Elizabeth are buried in the cemetery on Chester Lewis farm in Rowan County, Kentucky.

Samuel Caudill is the son of Matthew Caudill and Sarah Webb. He was born September 24, 1804 in North Carolina, and died August 13, 1883 in Morehead, Rowan County, Kentucky. Samuel married Sarah Maggard in Perry County, Kentucky on March 31, 1825. About the time of the civil war Samuel and Sarah settled into Rowan County, Kentucky. Samuel and Sarah are both buried on the old farm near Morehead, Kentucky. A large number of Rowan County families can tie into the children of Samuel and Sarah Caudill.

The marriage of Abner Caudill and Leah Short did not last long. He died fighting in the civil war. They had no children. Leah went on to marry Robert Paris Christian, another large family of Rowan County. Robert Paris Christian is also the brother of Rosanna Christian who married David Caudill, Abner's brother.

Henry C. Caudill and Elizabeth Short are the grandparents of Rebecca Caudill, the wife of Tilden Henry Caudill.

John M. Caudill, brother of Henry C., and Fannie Pennington are the parents of Tilden Henry Caudill.

Just look in the Morehead phone book and you can probably link every family surname with the Caudill family in one way or the other.

Each of the children of Samuel and Sarah Caudill had very large families of their own. These families remained in Rowan County building the history of Morehead. Many businessmen, banker, doctors, educators, lawyers, postmasters, sheriffs, jailers, judges, craftsmen, and farmers came from this large family.

#### Matthew Caudill

Matthew Caudill is the son of James Caudill Sr. and Mary Yarborough. He was born about 1772 in Virginia and died before 1850 in Letcher County, Kentucky. He married Sarah Webb (date unknown). Matthew is listed in the 1810 Floyd County, Kentucky census, but in the 1850 census Sarah is listed living near her son Abel.

### James Caudill Sr.

James Caudill Sr. is the son of Stephen and Mary Caudill. He was born around 1718, place of birth unknown. James married Mary Yarborough. It is not known where James and Mary married or died. It is believed that they are probably buried in Wilkes County, North Carolina.

By the early 1800's the sons of James and Mary had moved to Kentucky. In the 1810 Floyd County, Kentucky census, James Jr. and Matthew had moved to Letcher County that was then part of Floyd County, Kentucky.

James Jr. and Stephen fought in the battle of Kings Mountain in North Carolina during the Revolutionary War.

Fannie Pennington, wife of John M. Caudill ties into James Caudill Jr. and Mary Adams line. Their daughter Abigail Caudill married William Pennington, and they are the parents of Elijah Pennington, Fannie's father. Their other daughter Sarah Elizabeth Caudill marries

James Caudill from Georgia (nothing more is known about his family line) and their daughter Sarah Elizabeth Caudill, marries Elijah Pennington and is the mother of Fannie Pennington.

The 20<sup>th</sup> century writer from Letcher County, Kentucky, Harry M. Caudill ties into Stephen Caudill, son of James Caudill Jr. and Mary Adams.

### Stephen Caudill

Stephen Caudill is considered to be the progenitor of our family tree. It is not known when or where he was born, or if he was the first generation, second or third in America. It is speculated that he is of Scottish origin.

His wife's name was Mary (maiden name unknown). They are listed on deeds in Virginia. Stephen would sign his name with a "S" and Mary would use a "H". The "H" could have been for her maiden name, but is unknown. The following families of Hardin, Harrison, Hammonds, and Hardaways were living in the same parish as Stephen Caudill and Mary. Mary could have belonged to one of these families.

The Caudill name was spelled many different ways. Caudle, Cordell, Cordill, Cordle, Cadle, and Cawdle were just a few variations of the spelling. It is thought to be a derivative of the old English surname "Caldwell". It is also thought to be of Spanish origin with the movement of Spain into Scotland, from the name "Caudillo" which means leader. Basically the story goes that Caudillo's were members of the Spanish Armada, with some of the damaged ships cast upon the coast of Scotland. Some of the shipwrecked Caudillo's settled inland.

The only children of Stephen and Mary Caudill are:
