Historiography

The Alderson Coat of Arms illustrated left was drawn by an heraldic artist from information officially recorded in ancient heraldic archives. Documentation for the Alderson Coat of Arms design can be found in Burke's General Armory. Heraldic artists of old developed their own unique language to describe an individual Coat of Arms. In their language, the Arms (shield) is as follows:

"Ar. three saracens' heads affrontee coupé at the shoulder ppr. wreathed about the temples of the first and sa."

When translated the Arms description is:

"Silver, three savages heads severed at the shoulder natural color. wreathed about the temples in silver and black."

Above the shield and helmet is the Crest which is described as:

"A dove, holding in the beak an olive branch ppr."

A translation of the Crest description is:

"A dove, holding in the beak an olive branch natural color."

Family mottos are believed to have originated as battle cries in medieval times. A Motto was not recorded with the Alderson Coat of Arms.

Individual surnames originated for the purpose of more specific identification. The four primary sources for second names were: occupation, location, father's name and personal characteristics. The surname Alderson appears to be patronymical in origin, and is believed to be associated with the English, meaning, "the son of Aldus." The supplementary sheet included with this report is designed to give you more information to further your understanding of the origin of names. Different spellings of the same original surname are a common occurrence. Dictionaries of surnames indicate probable spelling variations. The most prominent variations of Alderson are Aldhouse, Aldhous, Aldis, Aldous, Aldus, Alldiss and Aldersons.

Census records available disclose the fact there are approximately 1450 heads of households in the United States with the old and distinguished Alderson name. The United States Census Bureau estimates there are approximately 3.2 persons per household in America today which yields an approximate total of 4640 people in the United States carrying the Alderson name. Although the figure seems relatively low, it does not signify the many important contributions that individuals bearing the Alderson name have made to history.

No genealogical representation is intended or implied by this report and it does not represent individual lineage or your family tree.





YOUR NAME AND YOUR COAT OF ARMS -- -- Priceless Gifts From History

Until about 1100 A.D. most people in Europe had only one name (This is still true in some primitive countries today). As the population increased it became awkward to live in a village wherein perhaps 1/3 of the males were named John, another sizable percentage named William, and so forth.

And so, to distinguish one John from another a second name was needed. There were four primary sources for these second names. They were: a man's occupation, his location, his father's name or some peculiar characteristic of his. Here are some examples.

Occupation: The local house builder, food preparer, grain grinder and suit maker would be named respectively: John Carpenter, John Cook, John Miller, and John Taylor.

Location: The John who lived over the hill became known as John Overhill, the one who dwelled near a stream might be dubbed John Brook or perhaps John Atbrook.

Patronymical: (father's name): Many of these surnames can be recognized by the termination---son, such as Williamson, Jackson, etc. Some endings used by other countries to indicate "son" are: Armenian's---ian, Dane's and Norwegian's ---sen, Finn's---nen, Greek's---pulos, Spaniard's---ez, and Pole's---wlec . Prefixes denoting "son" are the Welsh---

Ap, the Scot's and Irish---Mac, and the Norman's---Fitz. The Irish O' incidentally denotes grandfather.

Characteristic: An unusually small person might be labeled Small, Short, Little or Lytle. A large man might be named Longfellow, Large, Lang, or Long. Many persons having characteristics of a certain animal would be given the animal's name. Examples: a sly person might be named Fox; a good swimmer, Fish; a quiet man, Dove; etc.

In addition to needing an extra name for identification, one occupational group found it necessary to go a step further. The fighting man: The fighting man of the Middle Ages wore a metal suit of armor for protection. Since this suit of armor included a helmet that completely covered the head, a knight in full battle dress was unrecognizable. To prevent friend from attacking friend during the heat of battle, it became necessary for each knight to somehow identify himself. Many knights accomplished this by painting colorful patterns on their battle shields. These patterns were also woven into cloth surcoats which were worn over a suit of armor. Thus was born the term, "Coat of Arms."

As this practice grew more popular, it became more and more likely that two knights unknown to each other might be using the same insignia. To prevent this, records were kept that granted the

right to a particular pattern to a particular knight. His family also shared his right to display these arms. In some instances, these records have been preserved and/or compiled into book form. The records list the family name and an exact description of the "Coat of Arms" granted to that family.

Interest in heraldry is increasing daily. This is especially true among people who have a measure of family pride and who resent attempts of our society to reduce each individual to a series of numbers stored somewhere in a computer. In our matter-of-fact day and age, a "Coat of Arms" is one of the rare devices remaining that can provide an incentive to preserve our heritage. We hope you'll agree that it is much more than just a wall decoration.

If you are interested in a more in-depth study of the subject of this paper, may we suggest you contact the genealogical department of any fair-sized public library. We especially recommend the "Dictionary of American Family Names" published by Harper & Row and also "The Surnames of Scotland" available from the New York Public Library as excellent sources on the meaning of surnames.

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INTRODUCTION - FORWARD

To my knowledge, this is the first genealogical report on the Warren M. Alderson family. I am sure that it will prove to be woefully inadequate over time and additional research will be needed to more accurately record the family history. Mistakes and errors will occur. However, this is a beginning point. Much information has been presented in this report to give a foundation for additional research. It is hoped that additional researchers will continue to build on this report. It is with a sense of great pride that this first book is published.

This book is divided into three (3) major sections:

- Section 1: (1) Narrative of Warren M. Alderson, (2) Outline of family genealogy, (3) alphabetical listing of the Warren M. Alderson Kinship Report and (4) an alphabetical listing of descendants w/spouses. (CHAPTERS 1, 2, 3, 4)
- Section 2: Consists of a NOTE Section. Additional family information is recorded in this section. Each item of information in this section is referenced to a document number for verification. (CHAPTER 5)
- Section 3: Original DOCUMENT Section. These are original documents used to substantiate the information recorded in the NOTE and Narrative sections. (CHAPTER 6)

To receive the most complete information from this report, it is suggested that all notes and documents be researched when referenced. Chapter 1, "Narrative of Warren M. Alderson" references Chapter 6 "Documents" directly. Chapter 2, "Outline of Family Genealogy", references the notes of Chapter 5 directly. The notes of Chapter 5 reference the documents in Chapter 6.

As a convenience to the author, each chapter is numbered beginning with a page 1.

The information for this book was prepared in November, 1995, and research was done sporadically throughout 1995. Research thus far has been done at the Genealogical Library of Salt Lake City, Utah, and Allen County Library, Ft. Wayne, Indiana. In West Virginia, research has been conducted at Charleston, Kanawha County and Logan, Logan County. In Kentucky, research has been done at Ashland, Boyd County, Morehead, Rowan County, Elliott County, and Bath County. Plans at this time include additional research county by county in West Virginia to try to find Warren Alderson's father.

My father, ELIJAH B. ALDERSON, (January 1, 1898) is the only survivor of Warren M. Alderson's firstborn son, Harvey G. Alderson and wife, Mary E. Adkins, as of this writing. He has been very helpful in aligning information.

Special thanks go to my wife, Anne (Willard) Alderson, for her tireless efforts in helping research this project. Thanks to Rufus Flannery of Morehead, Kentucky, for his helpful contribution.

In researching Warren M. Alderson, the first trace of location was in the year 1841 in Kanawha County, West Virginia. Warren was involved in a court action. He did not emerge again until the 1850 census. (Doc. 49, 53) He was located in Logan, Logan County, West Virginia as a merchant. Either Warren became extremely successful in the mercantile business or his father, who is unknown to this date, perhaps left him a legacy. However, Warren became involved in real estate while in Logan, W.Va. and became quite successful at it. He amassed at least 4, 870 acres of land from 1854-1858 according to Sims Index (Doc. 42) and Logan County Surveyor Records (Doc. 43, 44).

The only indication where Warren was born was recorded in the 1900 U.S. Census. (Doc. 53, 54) He is listed as being born in West Virginia. Warren married Rachel Hatfield (b:11/1824-d:4/4/1909) in West Virginia. No marriage records have been found yet but other records indicate it was in 1845. It appears that Rachel is a direct predecessor to the famous Hatfield Family (Hatfield and McCoy Feud). Warren fathered four (4) children while living in Logan, West Virginia. His four children are as follows: Harvey G. Alderson (b: 3/13/1851-d:2/14/1924), Cynthia (Ellis) Alderson (b:1852-d: ?), Allen G. Alderson (b: 1856-d:6/28/1931) and Sarah (Fletcher) Alderson (b:6/17/1864-d:1/30/1934). (Doc. 52) Family tradition holds that Sarah was the daughter of Col. Alderson and his Indian housekeeper. Ref: "Past Images of Rowan County, Ky. Vol. 1 & 2 by Juanita Blair. (Doc. 58)

In 1873, Warren ventured westward to Rowan County, Kentucky, and began to buy land. His entire family, including children and their spouses, moved to Kentucky sometime after 1873. (Doc. 40)

Colonel Alderson was quite a colorful person. He had many talents and used them well. He was active in and highly supportive of local politics (democratic party). He became an extremely wealthy landowner in the area. He owned/operated several mercantile businesses. It seems that wherever money was to be made, Warren was there to capitalize on the opportunity. He invested in many various industries: sawmills, railroads, logging, construction of new buildings, financing mortgages, as well as farming and land investments. Over the years 1873-1903, Warren became a powerful person in land wealth in Kentucky and a well-respected citizen in Rowan County and Morehead, Kentucky. In the Rowan County News Centennial Edition, dated May 10, 1936, pg. 23, the following article was printed:) (Doc. 34)

COLONEL ALDERSON WAS ONE OF THE EARLY SETTLERS

"Colonel Alderson lived where Ray Flannery's home now stands. He was a small man. It might be said that he was a weakling. He was a man of principles and one of the wealthiest in the county. It is said that he would pick up a hearth in order to recover a grain of corn and then have to pay \$5.00 to have the hearth put back.

One time when one of his relatives died (Abba Bragg, Harvey's first wife), he promised that he would take care of her seven children. He bought them all farms in Rowan, Bath and Elliott counties. These homes were at a distance from each other. The reason for this was that he did not want them visiting but wanted them to stay at home and keep busy.

Another story is told of how a preacher named Jack Howard, (Church of God) came here to preach. He was persecuted. He preached in a barn and crowds went to hear him. He came to the Baptist Church to preach. Three or four of the members got together and wouldn't let him preach. Colonel Alderson owned the mortgage on the church. He said to them, "By gums, if you don't let him preach, I will foreclose the mortgage." He preached. Still they were not satisfied. They noticed that every morning he (Col. Alderson) went up the mountain. It was stated that he was meeting his lady friend. Someone was chosen to follow him. They did. When they came up to where he was, they found him kneeling and praying for the people of Morehead."

On page 66 of the above Centennial Edition in another article, the statement was made that in 1876, Morehead had two stores, one run by Warren Alderson and the other by Howard Logan. They stores were built of logs with moss covered roofs.

Another article from "Days of Anger, Days of Tears" Rowan County 1884-1887, written by Juanita Blair, gives light to the growth in Morehead, Rowan County, Kentucky during this period of time. The article reads: (Doc. 56)

"The railroad came to Morehead—first train in 1881—and the county began to experience a period of growth. Morehead, Gates Station, Cross Roads and Bristo vied with each other as Rowan's commercial center. Huge log drives were made down the Licking River. H. G. Price ran his steamboat, the "Gerty", upriver from Farmers to West Liberty.

Hogtown began to grow. A post office was established there and called Elliottsville. Store owner Charley Ward, first postmaster and town judge, got the town incorporated as Bristo. Jim Clark ran the blacksmith shop. There were two other stores, Sud Turner's and a branch of Warren Alderson's store managed by H. C. Turner. Alex Fletcher and his son, Jerry (Sarah Alderson's husband), started a steam mill on Christy Creek which grew into a flourishing business.

May of 1882 found H.M. Logan and Dr. C. P. Martin opening a drug store near the Doctor's Morehead residence. That October Warren Alderson and H. M. Logan began building business houses on Main Street. The next June three hotel owners were listed: Judge James Carey, H. C. Powers and Dr. R. L. Raine."

In April 1885 to mid-June, 1885, hostilities began to abound in Rowan County, Ky. The political climate in became very hazardous to one's health. Republican and Democratic factions began carrying guns with threats that killing of public officials would take place and some did. Again, quoting from Pg. 17, "Days of Anger, Days of Tears" by Juanita Blair and Louisville Courier-Journal, April 4, 1885, Pg. 2-3: (Doc. 56, 32)

"Tension between the rival factions was rapidly increasing. About 11:00 p.m. on the 30th of January, 1885, the back door of one of Morehead's wealthiest citizens was battered open with an axe. Three masked men carrying pistols forced the master of the house, Col. Warren Alderson, to open his safe. They then relieved him of \$400.00. Resistance on Alderson's part brought him a round cursing and a lump on the head from a pistol butt. The robbers said that they would prefer to kill him anyway, as he was a friend of Floyd Tolliver. He was further warned not to say a word against John Martin."

Three (3) men were indicted later on the Alderson robbery charge and found guilty.

The political climate became so hazardous that an appeal was made to the governor's office and many of the politicians had to move to Mt. Sterling, Kentucky, for their own health's sake. On page 23 of the same document above and the Louisville Courier-Journal same issue:

"County officials on both sides of the conflict journeyed to Frankfort to seek the intervention of Governor Knott. Many of Morehead's more prominent citizens temporarily relocated to the comparative security of Mt. Sterling. Among them were Dr. R. L. Raine, Warren Alderson, Circuit Clerk James W. Johnson, Robert and James Nickell, James Thmpson, William Trumbo and Z. T. and Allie Young."

Several quotes are being extracted from the book "Report on Rowan County Affairs" to give greater depth to the character of Warren M. Alderson and his social/political position in the community.

On Page 28, during open testimony, reference is made to "Mr. Alderson, one of the town Councilmen". (Doc. 38)

On Page 207, a List of Grand Jury for the August term 1886, reference is made about Mr. Alderson, "Alderson is no friend of any man who wants to do wrong; his sympathies are very strongly with Mr. Young." (Doc. 37)

On Page 480, same document above, Warren was called to the stand. In his interrogation he revealed that he was 67 years of age at the time, he resided in Morehead, Rowan County, Kentucky since April, 1873. His occupation was merchandising. He acknowledged being quite well-known in the area" (Doc. 40)

On Page 483, same document above, Warren is referred to as "the wealthiest man living in Rowan County, a very well known man, a well behaved man, a man of standing in the community, and a Democrat." (Doc. 40)

Colonel Alderson often put up bond money for the county sheriff and others who were in public service. He appeared to always be behind the scene but his presence and contributions were strongly felt.

Other sources clarify the Colonel's financial position in the community. One source says "H. M. Logan and W. Alderson, old residents, and Warner, Tabler & Co. are the leading dealers in dry goods, groceries and general merchandise." (Doc. 35)

Other miscellaneous happenings during the time period: "The Wednesday evening west bound freight ran down a valuable mule, the property of Warren Alderson, killing it instantly." Source: Morehead Paper, Pg. 2, April 20, 1882 (Doc. 36)

Warren Alderson's Formula to His Success

One day a young man asked the Colonel how he managed to accumulate so much wealth. The Colonel told the young man to come to his home that evening, bring a match with him and he would show him his secret to success. The man arrived at the Colonel's home that evening and was invited to be seated in the parlor. The Colonel asked him to light the fire in the fireplace for him. The young man did as he was instructed. The Colonel then said that the key to his success is getting others to use their full potential to his advantage. The Colonel gave the young man a good object lesson.

Colonel Alderson was a very busy man and did much traveling by horseback. It is said that he would leave home with his saddle bags full of money and be gone for weeks at a time. He was a mortgagee of land and purchased properties at public auctions quite often. On one occasion, he purchased 1,800 acres that were sold for taxes when a land swindle in Rowan County entitled "Queen City" was discovered. (Ref: Louisville Courier-Journal, July 13, 1886, Pg. 3 (Doc. 33) Warren continued to maintain his properties in Logan, West Virginia, at least through 1892. (Doc. 44) He had several court appearances there in 1876-1877-1879, having judgment liens against nine (9) of the Hatfields, to whom he had sold land earlier. (Doc. 45) He won each of his cases. It is suspect that these persons were very close relatives to Warren's wife, Rachel Hatfield. Family business was business without favoritism. In 1892, he sold timber rights to an Alexander Trent of Logan, W.Va. (Doc. 44).

Warren M. Alderson lived 83 years. He had a full life. He was an honorable man. He did exactly as the article "COLONEL ALDERSON WAS ONE OF THE EARLY SETTLERS" characterized about commitment to care for his family. (Doc. 34) In his will, each one of his children and grandchildren including his son, Harvey's seven (7) children by his first marriage to Abba Bragg, received a farm in Rowan, Elliott and Bath Counties, of Eastern Kentucky. Provisions were also made for the additional six (6) children by Harvey Alderson's second marriage to Mary Adkins. (Doc. 1,2, 3, 4.) They were provided land/cash inheritances. He gave two parcels of land to the "Kentucky Christian Missionary Church Extensions." located near Morehead, Ky. (Doc. 46, Pg. 2)

Warren Alderson was laid to rest on January 24, 1903, and is buried at Farmers, Kentucky, off Old Route 60 on State road 801 South in the Alfrey Cemetery, across from the boat dock at Cave Run Lake. (Doc. 30)

Warren was a member of Buchanan's Company of the 129th Militia which was organized in Nicholas & Logan Counties. Warren was released from militia service by supplying a substitute. He was discharged for unspecified reasons from the Virginia State Line. The 1870 US Census lists Warren as a resident of Logan Co., VA with his wife and four children. The 1880 & 1900 US Censuses list Warren in Rowan Co., KY. Soldiers in the State Line later served in the 45th Battalion, Virginia Cavalry and/or the 36 Virginia Infantry.

Enlistment into the State Line were officially for 17 to 18 years old or family men over the age of 35 who at the time in 1862 were not subject to conscription laws. Service was only for a one year enlistment and only within the local region. These constraints of service were attractive compared to the regular enlistments for the length of the war. Draft age men of Southwest Virginia would simply claim residence in states such as Kentucky where draft laws were not in effect in order to benefit from a shorter enlistment. The State Line regiments were known for their lack of discipline.

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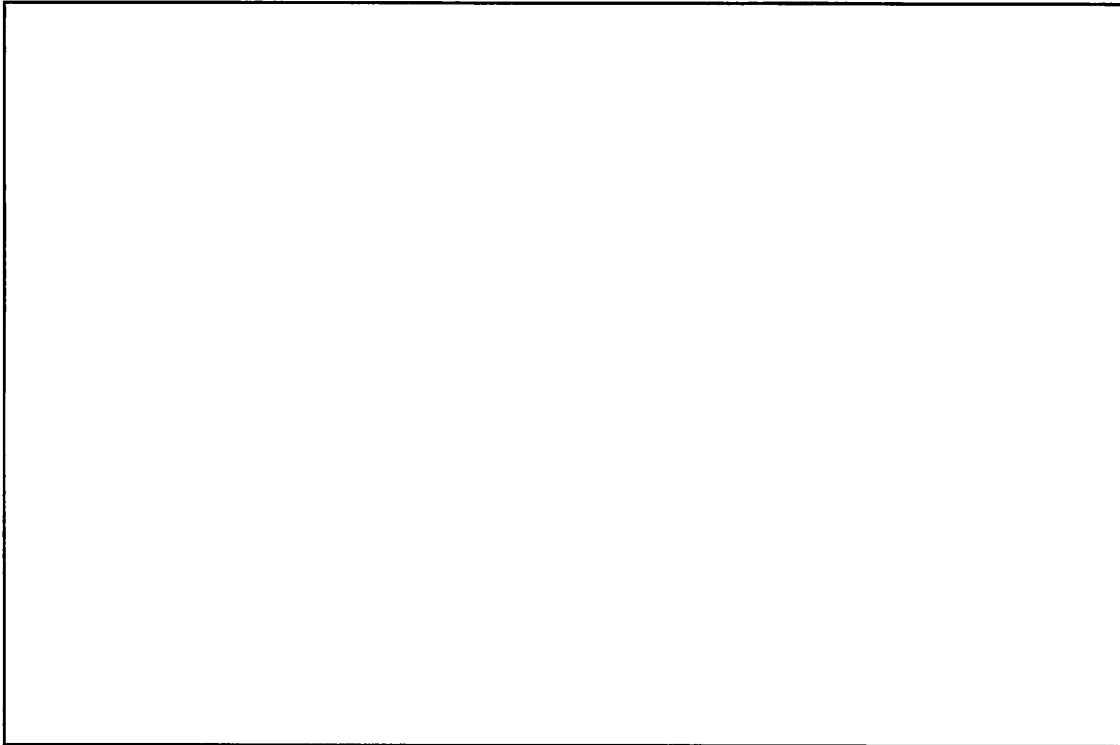

Colonel Warren M Alderson (1819 - 1903)

Several years ago, a parcel of land that had belonged to Warren Alderson was sold to someone outside the Alderson family. Because of restrictions on the land, the sale was protested by some family members which necessitated court action. My father, Elijah B Alderson, was one of the family members contacted to approve/protest the sale. Listed on the court document were many names of family members I knew little about. This became the beginning point of my research into the branch of the Alderson family located in West Virginia and Eastern Kentucky that had descended from Colonel Warren M Alderson, my great-grandfather.

After gleaning as much information as I could from family members, research began through other sources. David Fridley, Jim Cross, Bernard Alderson, John Alderson, Helen Boswell and numerous County Genealogy Societies in West Virginia and Kentucky were contacted to see what information may be available.

The earliest trace of Warren Alderson appeared in 1841, when he was involved in a court action in Kanawha County, West Virginia. He did not emerge again until the 1850 census where he was listed as a merchant in Logan, West Virginia. Either Warren became extremely successful in the mercantile business or perhaps he received a legacy because he became an overnight success story. Investments in local real estate amassed at least 4,870 acres of land from 1854-1858 according to Sims Index and Logan County Surveyor Records.

The 1900 U. S. Census gives the only clue to Warren's place of birth. His State of birth was listed as West Virginia. Although no marriage records have been found, other records reflect he married Rachel Hatfield in 1845. The couple had four children, Harvey G. Alderson (b:3/13/1851-d:2/14/1924), Cynthia (Ellis) Alderson (b:1852-d?), Allen G. Alderson (b:1856-d:6/28/1931) and Sarah (Fletcher) Alderson (b:6/17/1864-d:1/30/1934), family tradition holding that Sarah was the daughter of Warren and his Indian housekeeper.

In 1873, Warren ventured westward from Logan, West Virginia, to Rowan County, Kentucky, and began to buy land. His entire family, including children and their spouses, moved to Kentucky shortly after 1873. He became one of the founding fathers of Morehead, Kentucky.

While doing research on Warren's descendants, a picture of the man himself began to emerge. He certainly seemed to be a colourful person, serving just three days in the State Militia for the Confederacy during the Civil War, (supplying a substitute for the remainder of his enlistment). He had many marketable skills and used them well. He was active in local politics as a town councilman. He often put up bond money for the county sheriff, county district attorney and other elected officials during their tenures in office. Although he was best known as a merchandiser of goods, he invested heavily in other business and industrial enterprises, including sawmills, railroads, logging, construction, farming and land development. Colonel Alderson travelled much by horseback. Family tradition holds that he would leave home with his saddlebags full of money and be gone for weeks at a time. He was also a mortgagee of land and purchased properties at public auctions/foreclosures. On one occasion alone, he purchased 1,800 acres by simply paying the back taxes. A local paper printed an article some years after his death:-

Colonel Alderson.....was a small man. It might be said he was a weakling. He was a man of principles and one of the wealthiest in the County. It is said that he would pick up a hearth in order to recover a grain of corn and then have to pay \$5.00 to have the hearth put back.

One time, when one of his relatives died (Abba Bragg, the first wife of his son Harvey), he promised he would take care of their seven children. He bought them all farms at a distance from each other. The reason for this was that he did not want them visiting but wanted them to stay at home and keep busy." (Each of the farms was 100+ acres)

One day a young man asked the Colonel how he managed to accumulate so much wealth. The Colonel told the young man to come to his home that evening, bring a match with him and he would show him his secret to success. The young man arrived at the Colonel's home and was invited to be seated in the parlour. The colonel asked him to light the fire in the fireplace for him. The young man did as he was instructed. The Colonel then said that the key to his success was getting others to use their full potential to his advantage. The Colonel gave the young man a good object lesson.

The Colonel was a fair-minded and religious man. The story is told of how a preacher named Jack Howard, came to Morehead, Kentucky, to preach. He preached in a barn and crowds came to hear him. He then came to the local Baptist Church to preach. Three or four of the members got together and wouldn't let him preach. Colonel Alderson owned the mortgage on the (Baptist) church. He said to them, "By gums, if you don't let him preach, I will foreclose the mortgage." Rev. Howard preached. Still they were not satisfied. They noticed that every morning he (Col. Alderson) went up the mountain overlooking Morehead. It was rumored that he was meeting a lady friend. They decided to follow him one morning. When they came up to where he was, they found him kneeling and praying for the people of Morehead."

Warren Alderson was laid to rest on January 24, 1903, and is buried at Farmers, Rowan County, Kentucky, off Old Route 60 on State road 801 South in the Alfrey Cemetery, across from the boat dock at Cave Run Lake. His first-born son, Rev. Harvey G. Alderson, wrote the following epitaph on his tombstone,

"My time on earth is at an end. Before the great tribunal I shall stand and hear the welcome applause. Come now and wear the crown and forever rejoice. Heaven in all its radiant light, the victory and the crown and Jesus my Saviour ever in sight."

Warren was most likely awarded a Kentucky Colonel Commission through his standing as a respected and influential citizen of Kentucky. The Honorable Order of Kentucky Colonels has issued Commissions since 1812 but the current organization does not now have verifiable records back that far.

Unfortunately, despite all the details that have been assembled, Warren's parents have not been identified. It is definitely felt that there is a connection to the Elder John family. Warren was born in West Virginia and began his family in Logan, very close to the town of Alderson, West Virginia. His firstborn, Harvey, worked in Alderson for a while and married an Alderson girl, so there is a very strong local connection.

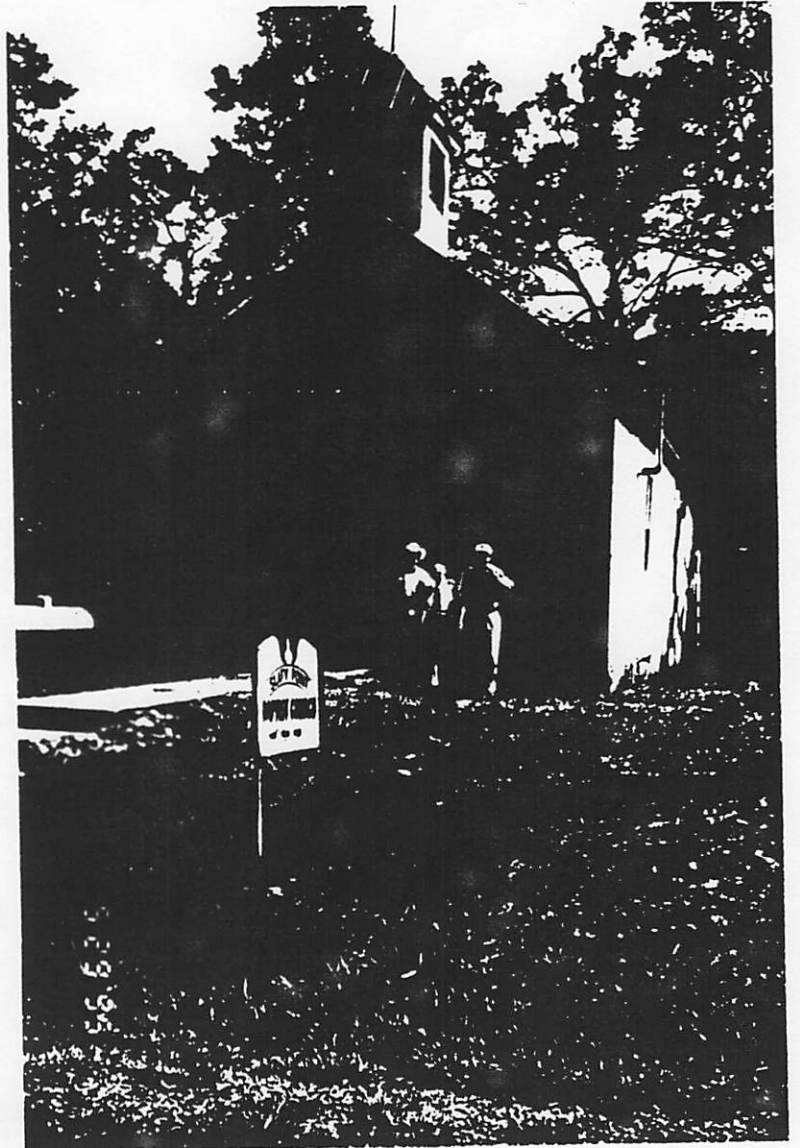

Harvey Alderson was an ordained Baptist Minister. He pastored a small rural Baptist Church named Slaty Point Baptist Church, Rowan County, Ky. The church is still very active as of these notes 11/1/1995.

Rev. Harvey Alderson wrote an epitaph on his father, Warren Alderson's tombstone. It reads as follows: (Doc. 7)

"My time on earth is at an end. Before the great tribunal I shall stand and hear the welcome applause. Come now and wear the crown and forever rejoice. Heaven in all its radiant light, the victory and the crown and Jesus my saviour ever in sight."

Harvey & Mary (Harvey's second wife) are buried at Farmers, Kentucky, off old U.S.60 at state road 801 south. About 1 1/2 mile to a left side road called Carey Cem Rd. It will lead directly to their graves. His actual date of death is 2/7/1924, Vol 10, Certificate: 4854. (Doc. 8)

Harvey was listed as the 20 year old first-born of Warren Alderson in Logan County in the 1870 census. (Doc. 49, 50, 52) He courted a young lady from Alderson, Greenbriar County, WVa. Rev. H.C. Tinsley married Harvey and his first wife, Abba Bragg at Alderson, Greenbriar County, WVA., on 2/2/1871. Abba's parents were Ira & Lucinda Bragg of Alderson, WVa. Evidence has been discovered to support the title of Colonel to Warren Alderson in Rowan County, Kentucky. Warren became a powerful person in land wealth from 1873-1903 in Kentucky and a well-respected citizen in Rowan County & Morehead, Kentucky. (Doc. 34, 35, 37, 38, 40)

Warren's Formula to His Success

One day a young man asked the Colonel how he managed to accumulate so much wealth. The Colonel told the young man to come to his home that evening, bring a match with him and he (the Colonel) would tell him his secret to success. The man arrived at the Colonel's home that evening and was invited to be seated in the parlor. The Colonel asked the young man to light the fire in the fireplace for him. The young man did as he was instructed. The Colonel then said that the key to his success is getting others to use their full potential to his advantage. The Colonel gave the young man a good object lesson.

Notes from "Days of Anger, Days of Tears" Rowan County 1884-1887, written by Juanita Blair. (Doc. 56)

"The railroad came to Morehead--first train in 1881--and the county began to experience a period of growth. Morehead, Gates Station, Cross Roads and Bristo vied with each other as Rowan's commercial center. Huge log drives were made down the Licking River. H. G. Price ran his steamboat, the "Gerty", upriver from Farmers to West Liberty.

Hogtown began to grow. A post office was established there and called Elliottsville. Store owner Charley Ward, first postmaster and town judge, got the town incorporated as Bristo. Jim Clark ran the blacksmith shop. There were two other stores, Sud Turner's and a branch of Warren Alderson's store managed by H. C. Turner. Alex Fletcher and his son Jerry started a steam mill on Christy Creek which grew into a flourishing business."

"May of 1882 found H. M. Logan and Dr. C. P. Martin opening a drug store near the Doctor's Morehead residence. That October Warren Alderson and H. M. Logan began building business houses on Main Street. The next June three hotel owners were listed: Judge James Carey, H.C. Powers and Dr. R. L. Raine."

"Colonel Alderson was one of the Early Settlers."

Colonel Alderson lived where Ray Flannery's home now stands. He was a small man. It might be said that he was a weakling. He was a man of principles and one of the wealthiest in the county. It is said that he would pick up a hearth in order to recover a grain of corn and then have to pay \$5 to have the hearth put back.

At one time when one of his relatives died (Abba Bragg, Harvey's first wife), he promised that he would take care of her seven children. He bought them all farms in Rowan, Bath and Elliott counties. These homes were at a distance from each other. The reason for this was that he did not want them visiting but wanted them to stay at home and keep busy.

Another story is told of how a preacher named Jack Howard, (Church of God) came here to preach. He was persecuted. He preached in a barn and crowds went to hear him. He came to the Baptist Church to preach. Three or four of the members got together and wouldn't let him preach. Colonel Alderson owned the mortgage on the church. He said to them, "By gums, if you don't let him preach, I will foreclose the mortgage." He preached. Still they were not satisfied. They noticed that every morning he went up the mountain. It was stated that he was meeting his lady friend. Someone was chosen to follow him. They did. When they came up to where he was, they found him kneeling and praying for the people of Morehead.

Rachel Alderson is buried at Farmers, Kentucky, off old US 60 highway on state road 801 south, in the Alfrey Cemetery across from boat launch at the lake. (Doc. 8, 30)

Warren passed away in January, 1903. Rachel contested Warren's will on 18 July 1903 in Rowan County Court, Ky. (Doc. 3, 4) She felt she should have received one-half of all of Warren's estate. Warren's will was finally probated and Warren's entire family (children/grand-children) received his estate with an adequate comfortable living provided for Rachel for her lifetime. (Doc. 1, 2, 4)

Rachel was born in the Logan, W.Va. area and was related to the famous Hatfield family (Hatfield-McCoy Feud). Deed records indicate that Warren sold James, Joseph Jr., Harrison, Valentine, Ellison, Anderson, Ferrell, Mitchell and J.W., all Hatfields, parcels of land. He also had to have judgement liens against each one of them for default in the purchase contract of their land. They must have been brothers or cousins to Rachel. One of them could well have been her father. (Doc. 45)

Typical of the time period, Rachel never learned to read and write. (Doc 6)

Harvey G. Alderson, Rachel's firstborn, was given full authority to become her power-of-attorney (Doc. 5, 6)

Harvey & Mary (Harvey's second wife) are buried at Farmers, Kentucky, off old U.S.60 at state road 801 south. About 1 1/2 mile to a left side road called Carey Cem Rd. It will lead directly to their graves. His actual date of death is 2/7/1924, Vol 10, Certificate: 4854. (Doc. 8)

Harvey was listed as the 20 year old first-born of Warren Alderson in Logan County in the 1870 census. (Doc. 49, 50, 52) He courted a young lady from Alderson, Greenbriar County, WVa. Rev. H.C. Tinsley married Harvey and his first wife, Abba Bragg at Alderson, Greenbriar County, WVA., on 2/2/1871. Abba's parents were Ira & Lucinda Bragg of Alderson, WVa. Abba was 16 yrs. of age when she married Harvey. (Doc. 21)

Harvey's first wife, Abba Bragg, and a small infant are buried in the Howard Cemetery at Morehead, Rowan County, Ky. (Doc. 9)

Harvey received a land grant for 86 acres in Rowan County, Ky. on 8/31/1887. It is recorded in bk 109, pg. 509.

In his will, Warren forgave a rather large loan that Harvey owed him. Also, Warren gave Harvey land on Christy Creek and Dry Creek (Doc. 57) except for the one farm given to Warren's daughter, Sarah. (Doc 1, 2, 3, 4) (Paragraph 3)

Warren, in his will, also gave Harvey's children the proceeds from the many farms and parcels of land that were instructed to be sold and equally divided by Harvey's children by his last wife and the children of Sarah Fletcher, Harvey's sister. (Doc. 1, 2)

LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT OF WARREN M. ALDERSON

Rowan County Court December 1903 Term.

In the name of God, Amen. I, Warren Alderson of Rowan County, Kentucky, being of sound and disposing mind, do make, ordain and constitute this my last will and testament. I commend my Spirit to God, who gave it and my body. I resign to the dirt and dispose of my property and effects as follows:

- 1st I will all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid.
- 2nd I will that my beloved wife, Rachel Alderson, shall have a decent and comfortable maintenance during her life and that her funeral expenses be paid out of my estate.
- 3rd I will that my son, Harvey Alderson, shall have all the debts he now owes me, whether evidenced by note or otherwise, said debts to be canceled and not collected from him. Said Harvey Alderson shall also have the use and benefit of that portion of the farm on which he now lives known as the Kennedy farm for and during his natural life and after his decease, said land to go to parties hereinafter named.
- 4th I gave my son A. G. Alderson, about 19 or 20 years ago half interest in a stock of dry goods, groceries, etc. and also a farm I bought from Dehart at Elliottville, Rowan County, Ky. and he has had its use and benefit of said farm ever since and of the proceeds received from the sale of said stock of dry goods, groceries, etc., all of which together with the interest on same would amount to more than Four Thousand dollars (\$4,000) and in addition to the property given him, I will and bequest him the further sum of One dollar (\$1.00) and no more.
- 5th Having heretofore together with my wife, Rachel, deeded to my grand-daughter, Cynthia Ramey, the oldest daughter of my son, Harvey Alderson, and wife of John Ramey and her children, the Fanning farm where she now lives and said farm is to be all her part of my estate except as hereinafter stated.
- 6th Having heretofore together with my wife deeded to my grand-daughter, Rachel Farley, wife of Elbert Farley and her children, the farm I bought from F. L. Kitchens, on the open fork of Little Sandy Hook, Elliott County, Kentucky, where she now lives and said farm is to be all her part of my estate except hereinafter stated.
- 7th Having heretofore deeded to my grand-daughter, Martha Flannery, wife of Lonnie Flannery and her children, the farm known as the John Moody and William Ramey farm, and same to be all her part of my estate except as hereinafter named.
- 8th Having heretofore together with my wife deeded to my grand-daughter, Mary Ellis, wife of John Ellis and her children, the farm known as the P. Alley farm and same to be all her part of my estate except as hereinafter named.
- 9th Having heretofore together with my wife conveyed to my grand-daughter, Rachel Ellis etc., the farm known as the Cogswell farm, where I now live and same is to be all her part of my estate except as hereinafter named.
- 10th I will that my grand-son, Willie Alderson, shall have between Four and Five Thousand dollars (\$4,000) and (\$5,000) of my estate invested in good fertile farming lands by my executor provided I do not live long enough to invest same for him and said executor to have deed executed to said Willie Alderson with same provisions and in like manner as the deeds I made to my other grand-children.

- 11th I will to Sarah Fletcher and her children the farm on Christy Creek where the family lives. Said farm, known as the Fulby farm, the same farm I bought from Scott Fulby. Also to the said Sarah Fletcher and her children, the William Thomas farm of about 75 acres in Rowan County, Ky., this to be all her part of my estate except as hereinafter named.
- 12th I will that the children of my son, Harvey Alderson, which he has now by his last wife or may hereafter have by her if any by his said last wife whose maiden name was Mary Adkins, shall have all the lands I now own on the waters of Christy Creek and Dry Creek that are not sold by me before my death except the farm on Christy Creek, which I have here willed to Sarah Fletcher and her children for their use and benefit for and during their natural lives and not to be sold nor in any way transferred to any other party or parties nor shall said lands be subjected any debts that they or any one for them may contract but to be and remain for their use and benefit for and during the period of their lives.
- 13th I have other lands that have not been named in the forgoing part of this, my will to wit. One farm on Cofferas Hollow, bought from Wat Hawkins and one tract of land near tar-flat, in Fleming County, Ky., which I bought from William Johnson, each tract of land of about 100 acres and one tract of about 225 acres on Indian Creek, Lewis County, Ky., and one farm in Morgan County about one mile from Grithersville; one farm on the head of Middle Fork of Little Sandy, Elliott County, which I bought from Don Lewis; about 35 acres of land adjoining Shelby Nickell in Elliott County; 50 acres I bought from Henry Logan in Rowan County; 500 acres on Mill Branch, 50 acres bought from James A. Caudill and two tracts of land lying on the south side of the North fork of Triplett Creek, adjoining its lands of Abiner Tackett, one above and the other below the said Abiner Tackett's farm. I will that all the lands that are last named in this, the 13th paragraph of my will, that are not sold before my death shall be divided as nearly equal as possible between the children of Harvey Alderson by his last wife and the children of Sarah Fletcher, they to have the use and benefit of said lands after each one of said children is 21 years old, that is, he or she shall have its part of said lands for and during its natural life and it, their death, to descend to their children together with the lands heretofore set apart for their use and benefit.
- 14th Now I wish to be clearly understood. I say that Harvey Alderson's children by his last wife and the children of Sarah Fletcher, shall not have any land I have bequeathed to them except the lands on which Sarah Fletcher formerly lived as named before herein which is bequeathed to Sarah Fletcher and her children until they arrive at 21 years old and I will that each one of the children of Sarah Fletcher shall have the part of land bequeathed them as they arrive at the age of 21 years.
- 15th I will that my executor shall keep in repair and rent the lands bequeathed to Sarah Fletcher's children and my other grand-children that are under 21 years of age until each arrives at said age, that is, each of said children to have its part as they become 21 years old and all rents collected on said lands until said children each arrive at said age shall go to my estate.
- 16th I suggest that after the unsold lands named in the 13th paragraph of my will is equally divided in as near so as possible between the children of Harvey Alderson by his last wife and the children of Sarah Fletcher. Each family may divide among themselves or otherwise when divided, they may draw lots for choice and if parties are not perfectly satisfied in the divide, they may swap, exchange, or make any trade they may choose to make among themselves that is satisfactory but, bear in mind, it is not to go out of the family.

- 17th I will that my executor shall provide a wide blank book sufficiently wide and large in which he can make an inventory of all my personal property when appraised, setting out the appraisement bill in full and he shall enter thereon the sale bill of said property, giving the price each article brought and also the name of the purchaser and said property shall be sold on 6 or 9 months time if personal property, the purchaser giving bond with good and approved surity bearing 6% interest from date of sale until paid. My executor shall also enter on said book all the notes, accounts and claims of every kind and description I may have at the time of my death, if notes or bonds given the amount and date of each and when due and also the date and amount of each credit if any and the name of the party or parties who gave it in every instance, also enter the amount of every account order or claim of every kind and description in said book, a correct account of all rents received, who from, and for what property, also the amount paid out on repairs and all other necessary expences and to whom paid and what for and this book to be kept for the inspection of all who may be interested in my estate.
- 18th I have the following property in Town of Morehead, Ky. the most I hope to live to dispose of, to wit. The house and lot where I last lived in said town worth \$800 or \$900; one small lot I bought from Tom Ferran worth \$125; house and lot where Allen Tacten lives worth \$500; the house and lot I bought at Bishops sale with an iron roof same located on alley, running from main street back to old Hill property worth \$550; also the old Hill property with two small houses, thereon worth \$400; also the house and lot where Wm. Bivins family lives, near J. Wilson, worth \$125. and two lots and houses in Tates Station, worth \$350 to \$400. I will that my executor shall sell the above named property as soon as he can get a fair price for it or any of it if I shall not dispose of it my lifetime and if sold by executor, he to take a good payment down and give good time on the balance with interest from date of sale until paid and also claim a lien in deed for the balances of the purchase money. I also own one half the lot on the corner above where the Central Hotel burned worth \$250. Too, I wish sold also own 6 or 7 acres of land back of James E. Clark, taking part or about one half of his garden, as is Clarks wife has a little estate in said land and I thought it better to keep it until after her decease so it will be worth \$1,000. Then I think I want all the above property to be rented and will _____ until sold.

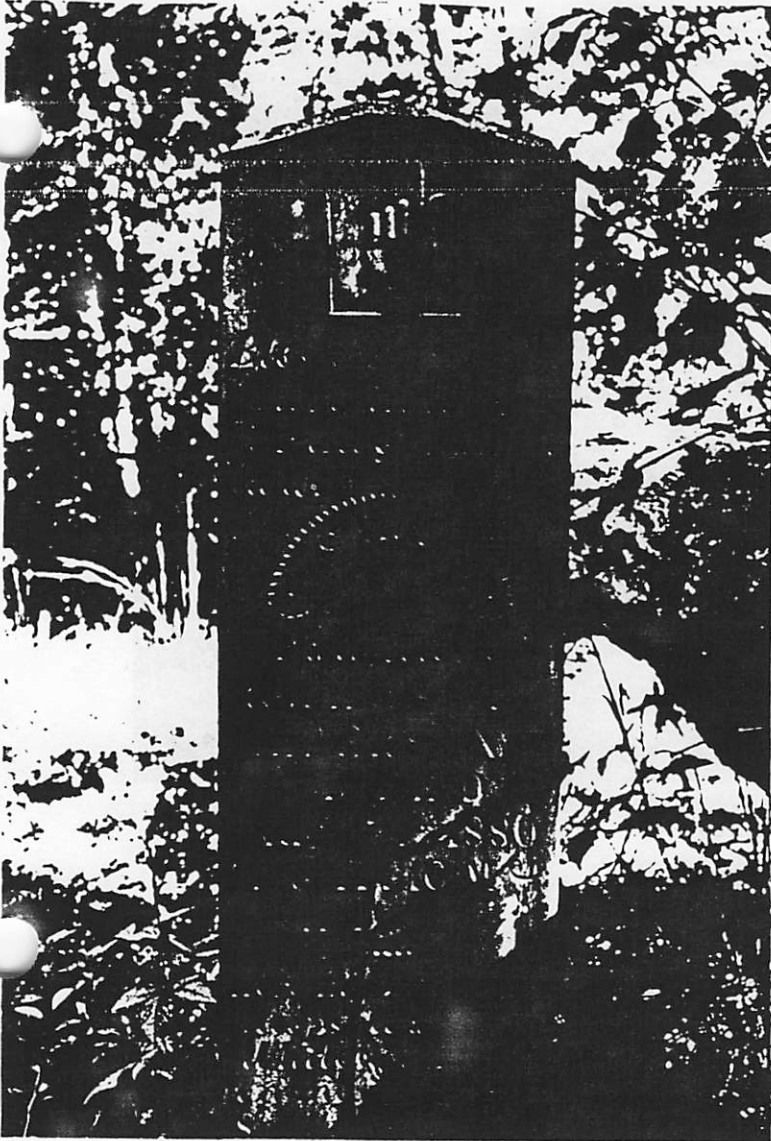


RACHEL ALDERSON BORN 1825 DIED APRIL 4, 1909

SPEAKS FOR HIMSELF.

County Attorney Young, of Rowan, Writes in Reply to a Mr. Sterling Special. [To the Editor of the Courier-Journal.] MOREHEAD, KY., April 16.—I see a communication in your paper of the 14th inst., purporting to be from Mr. Sterling, in which the writer says, "the hand of the County Attorney is seen through all this," meaning myself, as I am County Attorney of this county. The article also charges my son, Alvin, with assisting in getting up a petition to have Craig Toliver appointed Marshal of the town of Morehead.

As far as this article refers to me, it is false. I did not sign the petition, and I was not at home when Toliver was appointed; did not advise or aid in any way to have him appointed, and my son says to me that he did not have anything to do with the matter in any way.

After reading the communication in your paper, I obtained and examined the petition, which is as follows:

We, the undersigned petitioners, do hereby petition Hon. James Stuart, County Judge for Rowan county, to appoint B. C. Toliver a Marshal for Morehead, believing Mr. Toliver to be an efficient, competent and suitable person to fill said position.

I have used my best efforts to preserve peace, and I hope I may never so far forget myself as to say or do anything to aid in bringing about discord and bloodshed in the county in which I live. Point, was charged with disorderly conduct of a very peculiar character. lots in Queen City were 25 by 100 feet, and as their price ranged from \$2.50 to \$4, they found a ready sale, and hundreds and hundreds were bought by people from all over the country. James Appleby, a wealthy hotel-keeper of Montreal, was especially impressed with the grand future and the flourish- ing present of Queen City. He exchanged his hotel property for a block in Queen City and several thousand acres of land in the surrounding country. His hotel in Montreal was worth \$100,000. After the deeds to the property were made by the Queen City Building Association, Appleby concluded that he would come down to Kentucky and look at his Rowan-county property. The C. and O. railroad then did not run further east than Mt. Sterling, and the site of Queen City, as given in the map, was at least fifty miles from any railroad. After exploring the country for some time and inquiring in vain of the natives the location of Queen City, Appleby found the great metropolis. There was no lake there. There was no fresh water for miles. There were no railroads and no handsome country residences. The only building in Queen City was an old, tumble-down, abandoned farm house. The eighteen hundred acres of land was and still is covered with red brush, and the soil too poor to produce black-eyed peas.

Appleby at once entered suit in the Rowan Circuit Court to recover his Montreal property, but pending the suit he died, and the case was abandoned.

A number of other persons who had in- vested in Queen City property tramped across the mountains to look at their new possessions. When they saw what the place was, many of them abandoned their claims, not deeming the land worth enough to pay for recording the deeds in the clerk's office.

Some of the deeds are now recorded here, and on the top of each sheet of paper is a miniature lithograph of Queen City in all its beauty. Sewell, who held possession of the Montreal property, got up another land swindle. Among his victims was an Indian, who hunted him up and blew his brains out.

This is not all the strange history of Queen City. Sewell, when he bought the land, had all the deeds made in the name of his sister, Mrs. Grigsby, and, therefore, the deeds of "The Queen City Land and Building Association" were worthless. Mrs. Grigsby, after the death of Sewell, sent money in a registered letter to pay the taxes on the land. The letter was sent to the post-office in Bath county, when it should have come here to Morehead. In some manner one of the defrauded purchasers learned that the letter was in the post-office, and the Sheriff attached it and held the money for the creditors. In the meantime, the 1800 acres comprising Queen City had been sold for taxes and were purchased by Mr. Anderson, the merchant at this place, and Grigsby in Morehead. Mrs. Grigsby still claims the land, and so do some of the credulous who purchased from the Queen City Land and Building Association. Thus there are three separate sets of claimants for the land, which is really worth nothing.

He was a Virginian who came to town a few years ago. He is a better friend to the friends of the Tolliver than to them.

[List of Grand Jury for the August term, 1886, read.]

A. Pelfry is an active participant of the Tollivers. A nephew by marriage of Jim Johnson. I do not know that he is an active participant. William Royce is an active participant of the Tollivers; he has a son carrying one of those needle guns.

Q. He is carrying a gun now?

A. Yes, sir. There is a warrant issued for him now for carrying a gun, one of those needle guns that Capt. Macpherson did not get. Hiram Braine is a Democrat, but his sympathies are strong against the Tollivers. I think you might call him an active participant on the other side. He has not killed anybody or hurt anybody, but his sympathies are against the Tollivers decidedly. J. W. R. Johnson we mentioned a while ago.

Q. Of the Tolliver faction?

A. He is a brother of Jim. John is not an active participant. William Barbour is a Tolliver man. Alderson is no friend of any man who wants to do wrong, his sympathies are very strongly with Mr. Young. Allen Garten is the same man we spoke of; he comes there regularly.

Q. Why did he not make the order ?

A. He told me he didn't know it had to be done.

Q. State whether you know that the County Attorney of the county has made records of the county in his own handwriting ?

A. Yes, sir ; on the 28th of last February. Under an amendment to the charter of Morehead, it is made the duty of the County Attorney to settle with the Town Council and the Police Judge and the Treasurer of the town of Morehead, and to present his settlement, made with them, to the County Judge for his approval, and requires that a book be kept for that purpose, to get the matter straight on the record. On the 28th of February, Allie Young said he had made a settlement with the Trustee and the Police Judge, and came into the County Clerk's office on that day, and took the record, and spread the settlement on the record, and asked the Clerk to make a voucher making him an allowance. Q. By the Chairman: Have you any idea what the forfeited bonds that have not been collected amount to?

A. Do you mean where judgments are on them?

Q. I mean forfeited bonds that remain uncollected, judgments and all?

A. No, sir, I have not much idea.

Q. Have you any idea of about what they amount to?

A. The forfeited bonds usually range about \$100; there are very few that run up to \$600.

Q. Do all the forfeited bonds amount to as much as \$10,000 from 1884 to now?

A. No, sir.

Q. Do they amount to as much as \$8,000?

A. It might reach that; I never tried to estimate that.

Q. What is the cause of all these defective bonds being taken, bonds that cannot be collected?

A. I do not know exactly. I have taken some bonds that when I took them I thought they were not good. The parties said they would be here, and usually they would. If we had ruled exactly to what the law required, the jail would not have held them. I took a bond a time or two when I didn't think it was good.

Q. Did Judge Cole give bonds to those people indicted for murder?

A. He took very few, if any.

Q. Were any parties sent to jail without bond?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. I will ask you if I didn't tell you that at Mt. Sterling?

A. Yes, it might have been the same way as when you were pumping me; and you had a greater reason for lying.

Q. If my word is good to support your character, why is it not good to support my own?

A. Simply because you admit that you told me a lie for the purpose of extracting something from me I did not care about concealing. I told you I was going to tell that.

Q. Did you ever have anybody arrested or furnish that information to the Grand Jury, and you were County Attorney at the time?

A. I don't know whether I was County Attorney at the time.

Q. Don't you know in February, 1886, you were?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. You kept it still as death from the Grand Jury?

A. I didn't keep it any better than you did.

Q. I only know what you said?

A. I don't think Albin told me who killed him. He told me who forged the order.

Q. You didn't tell that?

A. I didn't tell any of it; if I had undertaken to tell that I would have been between two fires, and been shot on both sides.

Q. Is it not a fact that you went to Colonel Alderson and then to Allen Alderson—but first to Colonel Alderson—to get the money for Judge, and was representing to Mr. Alderson that you wanted the money for Judge Cole, and Colonel was a little afraid to let you have the money without Judge Cole signing the note; and then you went to Allen Alderson, and he agreed to let you have it; but then he got scared and backed out, and finally you and I made a note in the Mt. Sterling National Bank and got the money?

A. I recollect I said to them to put up that money and Judge Cole would see that it was returned, or words to that effect. Allen Alderson, and may be the old man, went to Judge Cole and asked him if he would do it, and he said no—he had no money, and said he would not have any thing to do with it; and Allen came back and said Judge Cole won't do it, and I said I would do it, and afterwards I went on your note as surety and got the money.

Q. By Mr. Wadsworth: You saw Mr. Macpherson there while he was there with the troops?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. Just before he left there, in a conversation with him, did you hear his opinion of the conduct of Judge Cole while on the bench as Judge?

A. A short time before I left—I would not undertake to say the number of days—he said that some of them were talking against Judge Cole, but that he saw no reason for it; that he thought Judge Cole was a conscientious and good man, and saw no reason for complaint, or words to that effect, conveying that idea.

Warren Alderson called for Judge Cole, being duly sworn, and examined by Mr. Wadsworth, testified as follows:

Q. What is your age?

A. Sixty-seven, I think.

Q. Where do you reside?

A. Morehead, Rowan county.

Q. How long have you been a citizen of Morehead?

A. Since April, 1873.

Q. What has been your business?

A. I have been merchandising, up to within the last two years.

Q. Always maintained your credit as a merchant?

A. I think so.

Q. You are pretty well acquainted in the county?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. Do you know Judge Cole?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. And the county officers that you have had from term to term?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. Have you served on a Grand Jury since Judge Cole has been on the bench?

A. Once.

Q. When was that?

A. I think in the summer of 1886. It was when Mr. Caruth was there.

Q. Did you ever sympathize with either one of the factions?

A. I don't think I did.

Q. You certainly never gave them any countenance of any kind?

A. No, sir.

Q. Nor did you defend them by word of mouth or otherwise?

Q. You are pretty well known in that neighborhood?

A. I think so; I ought to be.

Q. What has been your politics?

A. I have been a Democrat.

Q. In the various visits of the gentlemen connected with the Governor's staff, and his Attorney General who came there to investigate about Rowan, have they ever called at your store to ask you any thing about that?

A. No, sir.

Q. On no occasion?

A. On no occasion whatever.

Q. That you have any recollection of?

A. I am confident they did not.

Q. Have you ever seen any thing to make you suppose that Judge Cole had taken any sides in that trouble?

A. I don't think I have.

Q. In the Grand Jury you were on, were you aware of any such state of feeling as the Grand Jury taking sides?

A. No, sir.

Q. Or members of the Grand Jury?

A. There was one member on the Grand Jury I thought was.

Q. Which side was he on?

A. The Martin side.

Q. With that exception, did you see anybody on the Grand Jury who tried to shirk their duty or screen any one?

A. I did not.

Q. What would you say as to the manner in which Judge Cole conducted himself as a Judge in the exercise of the powers of his office in that county?

A. As far as I know or ever saw, good.

Q. By Mr. Wright: Were you on the Grand Jury?

A. Yes; once.

Q. What one?

A. When Mr. Caruth was there.

Q. Indict anybody that term?

A. Yes; I am not certain, but I think about seventy.

Q. Which side did you indict?

A. Both. I did not know any thing about sides; I indicted from the evidence.

Q. Name some one you indicted on the Martin faction?

A. I do not know that I could tell you. I could tell you several of the other faction.

Q. What has been the cause of the trouble up there?

A. It is hard for me to tell you. We have had some bad men there.

Q. Do you think with the present officers you could maintain peace and order in the county?

A. Indeed, I am not able to say; I think we could. It has been quiet and peaceable for quite a time.

Q. Peaceable since the 22d of June?

A. Yes; reasonably so.

Q. Do you think there are enough good men in the county to act as Grand and Petit Jurors to try and convict people?

A. I think so.

Q. Is there want of confidence in your county officers?

A. There may be in some of them. They seem to be good enough, but a little timid.

Allen Garten called for Judge Cole, being duly sworn and examined by Mr. Sudduth, testified as follows:

Q. Where do you live?

A. In Rowan county.

Q. How long have you lived there?

A. I have lived there five years.

Q. Where did you come from?

A. West Virginia.

Q. You have been around the court-room considerable?

A. Yes, sir, I think I have been there every Circuit Court since I have been in the State.

Q. Saw the Grand and Petit Juries in that time?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. Did you in that time see any attempt by members of the Grand Jury to prevent indictments against either faction?

A. I did not.

Q. They aimed to do their duty?

Q. Did you belong to either faction?

A. No, sir.

Q. Were you on the Petit Jury that tried Garner?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. Mr. Young prosecuted him?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. He was found guilty?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. Was it a bad case of murder?

A. I considered it was, else I would not have voted for him to go to the penitentiary for life.

Q. Judge Cole tried him?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. How did Judge Cole conduct himself on that trial?

A. I thought correct, and as much like a gentleman as I ever saw any Judge.

Q. You have observed him on the bench frequently?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. State how you have observed him and what your conclusions are?

A. He always treated lawyers with kindness and friendship, and his instructions, I thought, were correct.

Q. You know Warren Alderson?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. He is, perhaps, the wealthiest man living in Rowan county?

A. He is considered to be.

Q. He is a very well known man?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. A well behaved man?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. A man of standing in the community?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. And a Democrat?

A. I think he is.

Q. By Mr. Reed: How did Mr. Young deport himself as County Attorney of Rowan county while he was holding office?

A. I always considered that he tried to do his duty.

RIOTOUS ROWAN.

A Full Report of the Deplorable State of Affairs.

A County Without Church or Courts.

A Temporary Cessation of Hostilities.

The Governor's Committee Reports a Plan of Compromise.

The Call for Troops Refused and Both Factions Sign a Pledge of Peace.

(Special to the Courier-Journal.)

MOREHEAD, KY., April 3.—The report of the troubles in Rowan county have not been exaggerated in the essential particulars; the county has been given over to lawlessness, and not even Judge Lynch sits upon the bench. Law and order are traditions around Morehead, but the reality is not in existence.

When I reached Frankfort this morning I was so fortunate as to meet Mr. Z. T. Young, the County Attorney of Rowan. He had been down with some other citizens to implore military protection and was returning from a fruitless mission. The Governor told

exhausted their powers, he could not order of the military. The Sheriff had the right to summon every able-bodied man in the county to his assistance, and until they had failed the State would not interfere. In vain Mr. Young protested that the Sheriff belonged to one of the factions, and was a prime mover in the disturbance. Gov. Knott said that, unless the commission sent by him to investigate some reason to report differently, Rowan county must settle her own trouble, grievous though it might be.

Mr. Young had on a new black coat, the shoulder of which a round hole, the size of a nickel, had been darned. It had been made by a bullet from ambush on the 7th day of March, and Mr. Young's right arm is still hanging useless at his side. When he was informed of my mission he stared in amazement and said, earnestly: "Your man, don't go. It is as much as your life worth to visit Morehead, for you will be shot down like a dog."

"Do you really think there is such danger?" I asked.

He made an eloquent gesture with his wounded arm. "I was fired upon from an ambush one evening during a snow-storm," he replied, "and was compelled to leave home to save my life. My son narrowly escaped the bullet of a desperado two days ago, and most of the prominent citizens have also had to fly. Several killings have been done already, and more may come any minute."

Mr. Young is now staying in Mt. Sterling thirty miles toward Lexington from this place. He said that it was as near to Morehead as safety permitted, and that it was the temporary home of a number of other citizens of Rowan.

ON THE TRAIN

with him were Mr. Jas. W. Johnson, Circuit Clerk of Rowan; Dr. R. L. Raine, proprietor of the Cottage Hotel at Morehead, and Mr. Warren Alderson, the richest man in the county. They had all received warning and had deemed it prudent to get out of the way, at least for a time: they had accomp.

ined him to Frankfort and were returning to Mt. Sterling, whose healthy location they have been finding peculiarly adapted to their constitutions, shattered by Rowan county malaria.

Mr. Young talked freely, eloquently and enthusiastically. The subject was an interesting one, and he had an attentive listener. When the train reached Lexington he got off, and while shaking hands with some acquaintances, ran plump upon Judge and Mat Cleary and Howard Logan, the leaders of the Republican factions. Logan spoke to him civilly, and asked him if he had gone down to have troops brought up. Mr. Young declined to answer. The other said he asked for information.

"If that's the case," said Mr. Young, "I did, but I don't think they'll come."

Logan then said Young had caused all the trouble in Rowan. The other said he had left expressly to avoid a fuss, and had not been to blame.

"You are a d—d liar," was the retort.

The lawyer declared that he was not a fighting man, and wanted no trouble, retiring to the train in a highly excited condition. He said his life had been threatened so much that at any time he might be assassinated.

At Mt. Sterling we were met by the news that everything was quiet, both the Toliver and Cary factions having left Morehead. Dr. Raine concluded to return home, but the other exiles preferred remaining in the secure retreat of Montgomery county. The news of the truce caused great relief among the neighboring towns, and two or three adventurous drummers resolved to visit Morehead. Another was the most disgusted, on the road; he was from Louisville, and was with Mr. Carlton, of the Carlton Opera Troupe. They were going to Lexington, and at Farmer station the train was boarded by two or three of the Tolivers. Carlton had an uncorked whisky flask in his pistol pocket and put his hand back on that, while the drummers asked the men what the devil they wanted with so many guns. The next instant Carlton was covered with a gun, and the commercial men learned what they meant. After begging awhile and throwing

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the flask out of the window, they were uncovered, and it was the happiest moment of their lives. The drummer went to Winchester this morning, but when he was asked he meant to go to Morehead, snorted, with indignation.

"I shall sell a bill of goods and get back to Louisville on the first train," he declared with emphasis. The fright had knocked the chipperness out of him when the train reached Morehead.

At 3:10 o'clock

THE LITTLE MOUNTAIN VILLAGE seemed almost deserted except at the station. The neat frame houses were nearly all closed and the town lay under the frowning sky and drizzling rain as quietly as if it had never been the scene of pitched battles for two days. The train was met by a number of mountaineers who asked eagerly for the papers and passed jokes about the fight. They regarded the new comers with some reserve, which wore off after a little. One started, all talked freely; some expressed the hope that there would be no trouble, and some were anxious to know if the troops were coming. Gen. Castleman and party had just left, but there was not much belief that their visit would accomplish permanent good.

It did not take me long to gather the particulars of the feud, though each man intimated that there was a world of unwritten history which nothing could induce him to tell. An old citizen, a non-participant, but

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begged that his name be withheld, told me the following:

The feud dates back to the Sheriff election last August. Cook Humphrey, Republican, and B. B. Goodman, Democrat, were candidates. Much drinking was going on, and in the afternoon Sol Bradley was shot and killed in a quarrel between the two parties. He was not in the row, but was killed by a stray bullet. He was a farmer and a married man. Circuit Court commenced in a day or two; John Martin and Floyd Toliver were jointly indicted for the murder. They were released on bail, and a month later met at the Galt House saloon in this place. A quarrel came up, and Martin killed Toliver on the spot.

The murderer was arrested and taken to jail at Winchester for safe-keeping. A forged order was sent down in a few weeks, and the jailer turned him over to Marshal

M. Bowling, who brought him back, as supposed, to an examining trial. At Farmers' station, eight miles below here, the train was boarded by a party of masked men, who shot Martin, in his handcuffs, seven times. He died next morning. They got off as quickly as they came. Who they were nobody appeared to be able to find out, and the February grand jury failed to return a single indictment.

The names of Floyd Toliver's avengers have not been whispered to this day.

The trouble had but begun. On the 7th of last month County Attorney Young was returning from some Magistrate's court a few miles out of Morehead. It was a stormy afternoon, the snow falling fast and furiously. In a hurry to get home, Mr. Young urged his horse to a gallop, but when about three miles out of town a bullet from a Winchester rifle took him in the right arm. He got to town with no further injury, but received warnings which he obeyed by leaving home and staying. Ten days later Deputy Sheriff Stewart Bumgardner was on his way to Hometown, as Elliottsville is pleasantly denominated. The road runs for miles through a deep gorge, on the sides of which, a few miles from here, an armed party

bullets, making the fourth victim, and his blood has hardly yet faded from the mountain road.

THIS LAST KILLING

set both factions in a blaze, and they armed openly. Firing began here Wednesday, then ex-Sheriff Day was missed by some one who was secreted in a house up town. Allie, youngest son of the County Attorney, was treated in the same way, and he too has fled. The next to follow were Taylor and his young brother, and both are now at Mt. Sterling. Many citizens have followed this example, among them being Robert and James Nickel, James Thompson, Wm. Trumbo, Warren Alderson and James W. Johnson. All are accompanied by their families, and will stay at Mt. Sterling till peace has been restored.

I asked the man why Sheriff Humphrey did not stop the fighting. "He can't do it, and besides he belongs to the Republican faction. He has always borne a good reputation, but it seems that he has been made a tool by some of the leaders. Deputy Bumgardner, who was killed, Humphrey brought from Elliott county, where he had the reputation of being a fighter and a desperate character. Nobody knew anything about him, and it was thought he was brought here expressly to fight for his crowd. Since his death Humphrey has brought a man named Pearce from Greenup, where he is said to be under indictment for murder. He is the man who shot at Allie Young, by direction of the Sheriff, who was heard by a prominent citizen to give the order. Humphrey would like to resign, but Judge Carey and Howard Logan, the Republican leaders, would not let him give up the fight. When or how it will end only God knows."

A few days ago, D. M. Dillon, a non-combatant and friend to both parties, was sworn in as Deputy, expressly to make peace. He carried messages between the two factions, and finally all but Logan and Carey promised to shake hands and bury the trouble. They said they wouldn't humble themselves to any man, and that settled it. Judge Carey keeps the Gault House, and Wednesday his

gang fortified it and opened fire on the Tollivers. The fusillade was kept up, off and on, till yesterday, when Jeff. Bowling met Pearce and Humphrey on the street. Bowling is a dangerous young fellow, and demanded to know if the Sheriff brought Pearce to kill him, and he was told no, but suspected foul play and covered them with his revolver. They retreated, but when they were 100 yards away opened a fire, which he returned. Bullets flew around briskly for a few minutes, but no one was hurt. A little while afterwards one of the Carey boys came around the other faction, but was made to return by Craig Toliver, their leader."

He said further that the two parties are about fifteen in number, all

ARMED WITH REPEATING RIFLES and revolvers. The quarrel has been made a semi-political one, though there is no bitterness between the outside members of the other party. The Republicans, as near as my informant could recall their names, were Sheriff Humphrey, Jim Carey, H. M. Logan, L. D. Logan, Alex. Bradley, Mat. Carey, Allen Sutton, Frank Hellman, Richmond Tussey and the man Pearce. The Democrats are led by Craig Toliver and Jeff. Bowling. Their followers are Marion Toliver, John O. Day and several others.

A good deal of firing was done last night, and it is reported that one man was hurt. The Carey and Logan faction withdrew. Judge and Mat Carey and Howard Logan are said to be at Frankfort, while their adherents are probably scouting around the country. The other party is reported as being in force at Farmers, but at any time either or both may return and the firing be resumed.

Craig Toliver and Jeff. Bowling came riding into town this afternoon. The two are typical mountaineers. Toliver is tall, all bone and sinew; his face smooth-shaven, and with a good-humored but stern expression. Bowling has a boyish face, but stalwart frame, though he can not be over twenty-two. They wear the usual garb of mountain farmers, and had their pants stuffed in their boots. They talked to me very freely and

as coolly as if the whole affair was the commonest thing in the world. Both said they were willing to shake hands with the other side if they could be sure of peace.

"They are as treacherous as Indians," said Toliver. "When you've got to fight thieves and men under indictment for murder and every other crime, you don't know what to expect. We will give a bond of \$20,000 to keep the peace if the other side will, and we will stick to the bargain."

Both had their pockets filled with 44-caliber cartridges, which they showed to me in a joking way. Careless as they seemed they were always on the alert, and had their enemies appeared instantly they would not have been taken by surprise. Both men are said to be afraid of nothing, they have nerves of steel, and either looks fully capable of whipping his weight in wildcats. They are here yet, and will remain all night.

It must be remembered that the two sides tell different stories, and I have heard nothing from the Republican faction; they are out of town now, and it is to be hoped they will stay, for if they come back there will be bloodshed to-night.

Mr. Young told me that bitterness against him was caused by his prosecuting criminals within the past few months. Last November an old man, named Gibson Hughes, who lives out in the country, was taken out one night and murdered, after a

barbarous torture. Twelve were arrested on the charge of the crime, and one (Wm. Garner) was tried the February term of the Circuit Court and given a life sentence. The others had not yet had trials. Their names are Bannon Logan, Tom Lewis, Buck Enix, two men named Cornett, two McClurgs, two Hanboes and one McRoberts.

The dry goods store of Warren Alderson was broken into a short time ago and robbed of \$450, for which Young and Allen Sutton, Harrison Ting and Wm. Martin indicted. Logan bail Sutton out, and it is claimed the proceeds against them were malicious.

How or when the trouble will end nobody knows. The general belief is that it will cease only when one or the other will be destroyed. Meanwhile there is no business going on, stores are deserted and schools closed. Most of the houses have been closed. There are no churches.

To-night the streets are dark, and nobody ventures out of doors, for fear of an outbreak. Only two hotels are open, and one has been used as a half-way ground for several battles. The bullet holes around the doors and windows tell an eloquent tale, whose end is not yet.

THE COMMISSION REPORTS.

Gov. Knott's Investigators Form a Plan to Settle the Row without Military Interference.

(Spec. to the Courier-Journal.)

FRANKFORT, April 3.—The city was in a buzz of excitement this evening over the arrival of Judge James Cary, County Clerk of Rowan, J. M. Cary, his son and Deputy County Clerk, and H. M. and W. O. Logan, merchants at Morehead. Groups of people gathered about the refugees and at the hotels to listen to their harrowing experiences of the past few days. It was evident the crowds were in sympathy with the refugees and desirous of having order restored in that part of the State, even at the point of the bayonet and martial law.

Judge Cary, who is a large, fine-looking specimen of the Kentuckian, said he was reared in the county, and had lived there all his life, and would regret to leave it, but if the law could not be enforced life

and property there would be valueless. He said that in order to reach Frankfort made a midnight flight from Morehead, making twelve miles and taking a wagon thence to Plumingsburg, where he boarded the train; that if the Day faction had known his intention to come here they would have had no scruples in preventing it, even at the necessity of taking his life. He gave an account of the origin of the whole trouble which is, in the main, correct as published in the *Louisville Evening Times* this evening.

JUDGE VAN YOUNG,

of Bath county, who accompanied the party to the city, said that confidence might be placed in the statement of Judge Cary as to the impossibility of the enforcement of civil law, for he himself was in attendance on the court at its last term and vainly appealed to the grand jury to bring in indictments against the offenders. No citizen could be found who was courageous enough to perform the clear and positive duty of a juror in the face of terrors of factions.

To-night, until 9 o'clock, the entire party were in conference with the Governor and Attorney General to hear the report of the Secretary of State and Adjutant General who returned from the seat of war at the 5 o'clock train. The report was read to them, and the Secretary of State related the treatment of the committee at the hands of the citizens of Morehead, and appealed to Judge Cary and party to sign an article of agreement for the preservation of the law and order, which they had previously refused to sign on the overture of the opposing faction.

The Judge in reply alleged that he had no connection with the lawlessness, and did not want to be forced into that attitude before the people of the State by the appearance of his name on a paper of compromise with the ring-leaders. He, however, agreed, for the sake of the restoration to peace and quietude that his interests would be best subserved by signing the paper.

THE REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE, which speaks for itself, is as follows:

FRANKFORT, KY., April 3, 1885.—To His Excellency J. Proctor Knott, Governor—Sir

The undersigned would respectfully report that, in pursuance of your orders, they visited Morehead, Rowan county, and, as far as possible, carried out your instructions to inquire into the cause of the trouble existing there, and report the state of affairs, together with such recommendations as, in our judgment, seem to be demanded by the public welfare.

"We found upon our arrival in Morehead a state of affairs which we can hardly describe—a county without officers, and utterly powerless to enforce any civil process whatever; the County Judge out of his office; the County Attorney out of the county; the Circuit Court not in session; no Magistrate, Constable or other civil officer, either county or municipal, through whom any civil process might be issued or served; armed bands had been in possession of different parts of the town, and for days had kept up a desultory firing upon each other, one house in which one of the belligerent factions was ensconced, having as many as 100 bullet holes in it, and the citizens in such a state of terror as absolutely to preclude the possibility of serving any civil process to preserve the peace. One of the factions was in possession of the town, the other faction having left the evening before our arrival.

THE WHOLE DIFFICULTY

seems to have primarily sprung from a political contest last August for Sheriff, resulting in the election, by a small majority, of one Cook Humphrey, who seems not to have been discreet in the exercise of his official authority. Soon after the election personal difficulties, culminating in the death of Talliver, and afterwards of Martin, arrayed two hostile political factions against each other, composed in large part of the personal adherents of these two men.

"We found the country in a state of chaos, though at the time of our arrival, 2 A. M. yesterday, there was comparative quiet. After a careful survey of the field and after conversation with everybody we met, and

after calling together a large representative body of the citizens and laying before them the object of our visit and our desire to do something to restore civil order without further effusion of blood or the use of the military arm of the State, we submitted the following basis of settlement in writing for the signatures of the belligerents on both sides, which seemed to meet with general favor and which we trust may result in a solution of the trouble without the intervention of the military:

'For the honor of Kentucky and the peace and well-being of Rowan county, we propose to lay down our arms, live peaceably and submit to civil authority, agreeing to assist in the enforcement of the law.'

"Our only apprehension as to the success of this movement lies in the fact that some of the leaders of one of the factions we had a conference with, and there seems to be, on the part of said factions, a mutual lack of confidence in each other. In view of the facts above recited we recommend that troops be not sent until the effort of pacification shall have been tested and some steps made to an effort by the civil authorities to enforce the law. J. H. MCKENZIE,

Judge Van Young, in speaking about the agreement afterwards, said that the only possible means of effectually quelling further

disturbances of the kind was for a special term of court to be held at once and presided over by a Judge out of the district like Judge Jackson or Judge Owsley, who have no sympathy for the friends or fear of the people in exercise of their duties.

Col. Castleman says the people in this part of the State can not realize how desperate the people in Rowan county grow in their defiance of law, and in parenthesis would suggest that, as there is not a church in the county, it would be a very good place to send a few missionaries.

When the committee arrived in Moorehead they found the depot in possession of a band of armed men. Addresses were delivered to them by each of the committee, including Chief Justice Hines, who accompanied the party, and the appeals were so moving in behalf of law and order that one old man, who was afterwards introduced as the father of Bowling, was observed to shed tears. The resitants appeared thoroughly exhausted with labor and fatigue of watchful defiance, and in a few moments after the addresses an agreement for a cessation of hostilities and to lay down arms was circulated and received the signatures of nearly all of both factions then in town. Thus ends, it is hoped, the war in Rowan for the present, but if either party to the agreement violate it, the Governór will order out the militia at once. If no special term of court should be called, past offenses of lawlessness will be tried at the regular term of court next August.

When the 1860 U. S. census of Logan County, West Virginia, was taken it included besides its present area all of present Mingo County and some of the southern parts of present Lincoln County. The compilation that follows, which is designed primarily for the genealogist or person seeking information about ancestors, relates to all the people living within what was Logan County in 1860.

Visitation numbers of families or households, and the names and ages of all persons listed in this census have been placed in this compilation, and families have been arranged in alphabetical order for convenience in finding them. A list of visitation numbers follows the census listing, and its use and purpose is explained there.

Any genealogical information that has come to the notice of the compiler follows the name of the person involved. In listing this information certain abbreviations have been used to save space, such as S. or s. for "son of", D. or d. for "daughter of", A. followed by a date for time of death, M. for "married", etc. Dates of marriage are shown when the record has been found. In some cases, where spelling of names is apparently wrong changes have been made to bring them into conformity with present usage, as the whole purpose of this compilation is to enable people of the present or future to relate themselves to people of the past.

Most of the genealogical information in this compilation has been obtained from records of various kinds and from various places. Many individuals have given valuable information and help, and among them David A. Turner of Madison, West Virginia, Mrs. Claude S. Fowler of Roanoke, Virginia, a native of Logan County, deserve special mention.

Sincere efforts have been made by all who have been concerned in gathering data for this compilation to maintain accuracy, but the faded and scarcely legible script of the old records is difficult to transcribe correctly, and it is also difficult to avoid errors when dealing with thousands of names. It is hoped that they are not numerous.

THE 1870 U. S. CENSUS OF LOGAN COUNTY, WEST VIRGINIA.

When the 1870 census of Logan County was taken it still included all of Mingo, so the compilation that follows covers the people of both counties. This was the first census taken by magisterial districts and there were then five such districts, Chapmanville and Logan in present Logan County, Magnolia and Hardee covering all of present Mingo County drained by Tug Fork and its tributaries, and Triadelphia, which included present Triadelphia District of Logan County and the portion of present Mingo County in the Gilbert area which is drained by Guyandot River and its tributaries.

Each district had its own census enumerator who assigned visitation numbers to families in the order in which they were recorded. In what follows the letter L precedes the visitation number of families living in Logan District, C those in Chapmanville, H those in Hardee, M those in Magnolia, and T those in Triadelphia. The boundaries of Hardee and Magnolia Districts differed then from what they are at present but all families whose visitation numbers are preceded by H or M were positively on the Tug Fork watershed of present Mingo County; those with L or C preceding their visitation numbers were positively in present Logan County; while those with T before their numbers were on the Guyandot watershed but could have been residents of either present Logan or Mingo County. This is mentioned for persons who may wish to know where certain families lived.

The compilation that follows has been designed primarily for the genealogist or person seeking information about ancestors, and similar compilations have been made for earlier census periods relating to the same area. Visitation numbers and the names and ages of all persons, have been taken from U. S. census records. This was the first census to list Negroes and the letter B follows their names.

Any genealogical information that has come to the notice of the compiler follows the name of the person involved. To save space certain abbreviations have been used, such as S. or s. for "son of", D. or d. for "daughter of", d. followed by a date for time of death, M. for "married", etc. Lists of visitation numbers for each magisterial district follow the census listings. Genealogical information has been obtained from many sources, a lot of which were records of various kinds.

David A. Turner of Madison, West Virginia, copied this census from microfilm, a tedious and difficult undertaking because much of the writing is faded and scarcely legible, and the compiler has had to deal with thousands of names, both in the census and in other records. Sincere efforts have been made to maintain accuracy, but all that can be done is to hope that errors are not numerous.

FLANNERY

RUFUS H. & MARGARET (ELLIOTT) FLANNERY

In the early 1870's Rufus H. Flannery, son of K. Hunter and Arvella (Flannery), and his wife, Margaret "Maggie" Elliott, daughter of George Melbourne Elliott and Tennessee Virginia Adkins, moved to a farm a few miles west of Sandy Hook—the first farm at the beginning of Wells' Creek. The original house was a two room log cabin which is the base of the house as it stands today, after many changes and renovations. When the Flannery's were living in the house, there was never any doubt as to which rooms were the original log cabin—the living room and the front bedroom were always cooler in the summer and warmer in the winter because of the care with which the logs had been installed.

Rufus was a farmer and served as sheriff of Elliott Co. from 1902-1906. He died at an early age leaving Maggie in charge of the farm and seven children to care for. Maggie lived until 1936 and is buried on this farm in the family cemetery on the hill directly opposite the home. Buried alongside Maggie is her mother Ten-

nessee (Grandma Tenny) and a sister only known to our family as Aunt Pink. Rufus is buried in the Vansant Cemetery on the hill behind the Frosty Freeze. Rufus and Maggie had seven children:

LONNIE BUREN FLANNERY: (b 14 Sep 1877) married Mattha Bell Alderson. Lonnie lived in and around Rowan Co. along with the majority of his children. Lonnie's grandson, Wilfred Flannery, served as Judge Executive of Rowan Co. for several terms during the late fifties and early sixties. Lonnie's children and grandchildren are as follows: RAY FLANNERY married Lucy Cornet and had two children, Joyce and Wilfred. He married 2) Eva Eldridge and had seven children: Thomas, Marcella, Phillip, Meredith, David, Rachel, Isaac and James.

BESSIE BEATRICE FLANNERY married William Poston and had one son, Glen. She then married 2) William Gilkerson and they had four children: Billy, Bobby, Don and Betty Gay.

ROSE FLANNERY married Kenneth Carpenter and had three children: Phyllis, Pamela and Kenneth, Jr.

DELMAR FLANNERY married Nina Reynolds and had three children: Kathleen, Martha Jean and Billy Delmar. After the death of Nina, Delmar married her sister, Mudge. They had no children.

LEONARD FLANNERY married Hubert Lacey and had two children: Martha Joy and Henry.

PRUDIA FLANNERY married Max Shay and had six children: Marlena, Maxine, Tamzene, Tommy, Terry, and Robert Bruce.

WOODROW FLANNERY married Ruth Burdollar and had ten children: Annetta, LeRoy, Mary Sue, William Calvin, Jimmy, Sharon, Sherline, Johnny, Gary and Patricia.

BEULAH FLANNERY married Elwood Dalton and had one son, Glen.

RUFUS FLANNERY married Gladys Caudill and had no children.

PRUDIA BOYD FLANNERY (21 Oct 1874 - 22 Feb 1908) married Henry McClain and had two children: Rissie and Clyde. Prudia died at age 29 in the hospital in Louisville, KY. Her daughter, Rissie, lived in New York for most of her life and after her retirement, lived in West Liberty with her Aunt Julia until her death in the mid-sixties.

WILLIAM "WILLIE" NEWTON FLANNERY (5 Dec 1881-17 Jan 1929) married Maggie Alderson. Willie lived in Florida for the majority of his adult life and ran a trucking business which hauled fruit from Florida to the mid-west. He was killed in a trucking accident in 1929 at the age of 48. His children are: Warren, Leila, Otis, Lilburn, Deward, Mabel, Kitty, Glaspie, Maggie and Donald.

JASON COX FLANNERY (27 Sep 1883) married Bessie Gilkerson. "Jacie" lived in the Bluestone area of Rowan Co. all of his life. His children are: Hazel Caudill, Julia Troxler, Leona Mae Miller, Roy Lee, Claude P., Thelma Jackson, Mary Katherine Roth, Russel, Jacie Lloyd and Culbert Leo. After the death of Bessie, Jacie married Hattie (?).

JULIA ROSE FLANNERY (3 Aug 1892) married Langley Adkins and had no children.

Langley was elected Elliott Co. Judge in January 1938. The following May he died suddenly, leaving Julia to fulfill his term until Harold Adkins was elected in the fall of that year. A few years later, Julia married Zachery Haney, a clergyman from West Liberty. She was widowed early in this marriage and lived in downtown West Liberty until her death in the early 1960's.

CLYDE RAYMOND FLANNERY (22 Apr 1894) married Leona Farley. Clyde and Leona lived in New Castle, IN, where their only surviving daughter, Dorothy, still resides. They had three children: Flossie, Dorothy and Donald.

CHAUNCY CLARK FLANNERY (27 July 1899-1 Apr 1970) married Effie Mae Click. See Chauncy Clark and Effie Mae (Click) Flannery Story.

CHAUNCY CLARK & EFFIE MAE FLANNERY

Chauncy Clark (b 25 July 1899) was the youngest of seven children of Rufus H. Flannery and Maggie Elliott. He married Effie Mae Click (b 12 Apr 1903) daughter of Henry Click and Dully Whitt in 1918 and they lived with Chauncy's widowed mother, Maggie, and cared for her until her death in 1936. Upon her death, she turned the farm (Wells' Creek farm - Rufus and Maggie story) over to Chauncy and Effie.

Chauncy farmed this land, and for some time worked for the State Department of Highways, until he became disabled with arthritis in the late 1950s. He and Effie reared seven children, of their own, and assisted in the upbringing of Luke Weddington and Cecil Howard, who were orphaned. Chauncy died of arteriosclerosis 1 Apr 1970. Effie lived on the farm until 1977, at which time she could no longer maintain it on her own. She moved to Fleming Co. and lived near her daughter, Aleene McCord, until 1985. She then moved to Columbus, OH and lived with her daughter, Gaye Bowling, until her death 15 Feb 1990. Chauncy and Effie are buried in the Memory Gardens Cemetery, Sandy Hook.

On another farm there was a large two-room log house which Vester purchased, tore down and rebuilt it on his Dad's farm. This was their first home. January 1885 - March 1885

- A Morehead Robbery - Shootout in Mt. Sterling -
-On the Road to Elliottville -

In the best of times the office of Sheriff during the late nineteenth century was not an easy position to hold. Duties included law officer and tax collector; bookkeeper and peacemaker. A sheriff's job was many jobs and he could easily leave office poorer in friends and wealthier in enemies. Young Cook Humphrey soon found himself rich in enemies indeed.

Tension between the rival factions was rapidly increasing. About 11:00 p.m. on the 30th of January, 1885, the back door of one of Morehead's wealthiest citizens was battered open with an axe. Three masked men carrying pistols forced the master of the house, Col. Warren Alderson, to open his safe. They then relieved him of \$400.00. Resistance on Alderson's part brought him a round cursing and a lump on the head from a pistol butt. The robbers said that they would prefer to kill him anyway, as he was a friend of Floyd Tolliver. He was further warned not to say a word against John Martin.¹

On the other side, Ben and Will Martin were notified that their continued good health would require a change of scenery. That they took their notification to heart is evidenced by the fact that Will sold a house and lot valued at \$300.00 to Col. John Hargis for only \$180.00.² Ben and Will then moved to Kansas. The object of their forced removal was thought to have been prevention of their testimony before a grand jury inquiring into the murder of John Martin.³

On the twenty-third of February what began as a minor altercation with Mt. Sterling law officers mushroomed into a confrontation that removed Alvin M. Bowling from the Rowan County conflict permanently.

Around 1:00 A.M. on the morning of the twenty-third, Bowling abducted Miss Mattie Scott, nineteen, from her Mt. Sterling home. They took the train to Olive Hill, where they spent the night together. The morning west bound brought them back to Mt. Sterling. There they took a room at the Turner Hotel, registering as man and wife.⁴ Miss Scott remained at the hotel; Bowling went out for a drink. One drink turned

into several drinks. Soon he was boasting openly on the streets of shooting John Martin.

At the railroad station Mr. Boyd, a Rowan County merchant from Freestone, was arrested for public intoxication. Despite some resistance, he was being dragged to jail when Bowling confronted the arresting officers and demanded his release. Bowling was initially ignored- but when he leveled his gun at the deputies his sincerity was no longer in doubt. Boyd was released to him.

Bowling and Boyd returned to the station. Deputy Marshalls J.D. Wyatt and John Gill followed, summoning a posse to assist in the arrest. Bowling was attempting to board the train when he was seized by Gill and others. He wheeled around and began shooting.

Bowling's first blast mortally wounded Deputy Gill. Another shot hit Howard Wilson's hand. Two bullets meant for Lindsey Anderson missed their mark. Bowling surrendered only when Anderson leveled Gill's pistol in his face.

Unarmed, Boyd was not charged as an accessory. Miss Scott returned home after it became apparent Bowling would not accompany her on the afternoon express to Cincinnati. Deputy Gill died, leaving a wife and four children. Farmers Marshal Alvin M. Bowling sobered up in the local jail.⁵ His defense would be insanity.⁶

As has been said, County Attorney Z.T. Young's attempt to hold himself aloof from Rowan's factional strife was doomed to failure. Few in the county were able to straddle the fence in the conflict, and it is not surprising that a man's political enemies should become his personal enemies also.

It may be safely assumed that the bushwhackers who lay concealed by the Elliottville-Morehead road on March the seventh were Martin adherents. About three o'clock that evening Young approached, returning to Morehead after a business trip up Christy Creek. He was in no hurry on this snowy winter day; his would-be murderers had plenty of time to take aim and snap off two shots, one of which entered Young's right shoulder and came out his right breast.

Keeping a cool head, Young whipped his horse into a gallop and escaped. Although suffering a good deal of pain from the rough three miles of road leading back to Morehead, he recovered fully.⁷ His glimpse

of his assailants was too brief to allow him to identify them.

Young blamed his recent prosecution of Gibson Hughes' killers and indictments brought against Allen Sutton, William Martin and Harrison Tinsley for the bitterness against him.⁸

After assuming office, Sheriff Humphrey had appointed the following deputy sheriffs: Fantly R. Muse (appointed 5Jan1885), Gabrail Humphrey (Cook's brother, appointed 19Jan1885) and Stewart Bumgardner (appointed 14Feb1885).⁹ It was Bumgardner who was to become the next victim of the Feud.

Deputy Bumgardner had accompanied Z.T. Young to Elliottville on the day of Young's shooting, both of them being involved, in one capacity or another, in a forceable entry case. Bumgardner did not return to Morehead with Young, saying he had "urgent business at Hog Town that he must attend to".¹⁰ About ten days later, Bumgardner, like Young before him, was riding alone on the road between Morehead and Elliottville in the late afternoon¹¹ when he was shot from ambush. Bumgardner's assassins were considerably more efficient than Young's.

Stewart Bumgardner's body was discovered by the mail carrier from Martinsburg (Sandy Hook) to Morehead. "Literally torn to pieces" with bullets and buckshot, the corpse was found lying in the road about six miles¹² from Morehead, near the headwaters of Christy Creek. Two Blair boys assisted the mail carrier in removing the body to the house of a neighbor for burial.¹³ Rowan County Court Records reveal that on October 5, 1885, James A. Caudill was allowed three dollars for an inquest on S. Bumgardner.

Ironically, Z.T. Young, interviewed in Mt. Sterling on March Sixteenth, stated that a number of his friends had banded together for revenge on his suspected attacker but he had counseled peace and expected no action.¹⁴

Four men had now died in a period of nine months. Bradley's death might be termed "accidental", inasmuch as it occurred in a mob situation and he was probably not singled out, just unlucky. Tolliver's death was self-defense or cold-blooded murder, depending on the story accepted. Martin's death was a calculated act of vengeance. But Bumgardner did not die in a brawl, in a face-to-face showdown, or as the result of a murder he had committed. His death, like Young's

shooting, was a simple act of terror, an object lesson. The law would henceforth be construed, by both sides, to their own advantage whenever possible. And in the end, for all intents and purposes, there would be no law - neither as sword nor shield. Twenty men would die in Rowan County from August 4, 1884 to June 22, 1887. In only one instance was a murderer successfully prosecuted for his crime.

The end of March 1885 found only one county official still at his post. County Clerk Carey alone remained in Morehead. He had received two or three warnings to go.¹⁵

The Courier Journal of 30 March 1885 carried an interview with Mr. Charles L. Gray, a Louisville drummer who plied his trade in Rowan County from March Sixteenth thru the Twentieth. In Morehead he found: Not much business. Men with rifles and several revolvers standing on the street corners. County judge, sheriff, marshall and deputies all gone.

Having business with a tobacco man at Elliottville, Gray pled with the mail carrier to allow him to ride there with him. Reluctantly the carrier agreed.

On the trail Gray's curiosity and incessant questions soon proved too much for the postman, who ordered Gray to shut up and stay at least ten feet behind him. When Gray began to object, the carrier pointed to a patch of blood on the roadside. "That's where they killed Bumgardner", he remarked. "They were in ambush, and right now there are men hid above us ready to shoot down their enemies if they pass this way. If they take you for one of these they may pop you over." The abashed drummer rode in silence for the remainder of the journey.

When they had emerged from the "deep gorge through which the road from Morehead to Elliottville runs for ten miles", the mail carrier informed Gray that it was customary for riders through the gorge to put their hands behind their backs as a sign of no harm meant.

Gray went on to describe the origins of the trouble, managing to confuse characters and events completely. He also mentioned that, during his stay, rumor had it a mob was being got up to go to Lexington to hang Alvin Bowling. Some people, among them his brother-in-law, say Bowling ought to be hung.....Gray reported.¹⁶
